

**The release of funds is subject to the following conditions:-**

1. All codal procedures be followed in letter and spirit.
2. There shall be no deviation from the decisions taken in the SLEC meeting held on 10.03.2015 and 27.07.2015 and programmes be launched accordingly.
3. The implementing agencies shall utilize the funds as per the approved Action Plan 2015-16 under Horticulture Mission for Horticulture for Himalayan States of Centrally Sponsored “Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) after observing all codal formalities and in consonance with the guidelines of the Scheme.
4. The implementing agencies shall obtain necessary sanctions/approval from the Government of India/competent authorities where-ever required.
5. ST/SC/Women farmers be covered as per the guidelines of the Scheme.
6. The implementing agencies shall maintain proper accounts of the expenditure incurred and submit the statement of audited accounts and utilization certificates as soon as possible.
7. The audited records of all aspects (permanent or semi permanent acquired wholly or substantially out of the grant should be maintained as prescribed in General Financial Rule 2005 and shall be furnished annually by the end of June, following the financial year to which it relates.

8. The assets permanent or semi permanent acquired wholly or substantially out of the grant by the Government of India shall not, without prior approval of the GOI, be disposed off, encumbered or utilized for the purpose other than for which the grant is being released.
9. The accounts of the implementing agency shall be open to internal audit of the Principal Accounts Officer, Department of Agriculture and Cooperation as well as the Statutory Audit by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India at his discretion and he shall have the right to demand the production of books, accounts, concerned vouchers and other documents and papers in this regard.
10. No re-appropriation/diversion of funds is allowed in any case.
11. The DDO shall ensure that the funds released are utilized prudently and judiciously as per the guidelines of the scheme and in no case he should book the expenditure just for the sake of spending.
12. The expenditure shall be incurred by the Implementing Officers after observing all codal formalities required under rules.
13. The implementing officer shall ensure that there is no overlapping/duplication in adoption of Schemes/incurring of expenditure from any other scheme of the State or Central Government.
14. The implementing officer shall restrict the expenditure to the actual availability of funds and no liability shall be created in any case.
15. The implementing officer shall furnish progress both in physical and financial on monthly basis for its onward submission to Administrative Department.
16. The implementing Officer shall submit utilization certificate of funds released soon after their utilization for onward submission to GOI to ensure further release of funds under the scheme.
17. The instructions conveyed by Administrative Department vide Circular letter No.02 dated:- 03.07.2015 endorsed vide this office No.Agri/Plan/2015-16/889-617 dt:-10.8.2015 be adhered to strictly.
18. Technical sanction for projects be obtained from the Competent Authority.
